



New Trailer Pump Units In Hawk's Range

By special request, we have built the first of the diesel powered 500bar tube/pipe cleaning machines. Powered by a 4-cylinder F4L912 engine, it delivers 27l/min at 500 bar. The pump is driven by the engine through a Fennerflex tyre coupler directly from the flywheel.

The next machine to be built will be the 200 l/min at 200 bar sewer cleaner, commissioned by a customer who will use it for large drains and sewers. It will have a hydraulically driven hose reel and a range of special nozzles. A 2000 Liter tank will feed the pump.

We will probably have photo's in the next issue of this newsletter.

It seems as though we will be increasing the large-pump side of the business.
